



Population Change in Salt Lake County


1940-2020





2010 to 2020 Changes:

- Herriman and Bluffdale more than doubled
- Herriman added the most new residents, followed by South Jordan, West Jordan, and Salt Lake
- Brighton incorporated, Townships formalized in Census Bureau estimates




Between 2020 and 2021, "COVID-19, declining birth rates and international migration resulted in historically small population gains"





2021 Salt Lake County Population: 1,186,421




The Census Bureau estimates indicate that between 2020 and 2021 the southern part of the valley added residents, while mid-valley communities lost residents


Migration has become a more consistent component of change

Utah Population Change with Components of Change, 1960-2020





Racial and ethnic diversity in Utah has played a critical role in population growth this decade.


Contributions to growth by racial and ethnic populations, 2010 to 2020

Share of Population Change by Racial and Ethnic Grouping in Communities and Salt Lake County, 2010-2020


Growth in racial and ethnic minority populations drove population change countywide.



Projected Population Growth with Components of Change in Salt Lake County, 2025-2060



Changes to age structure differ by county


Salt Lake County Population Pyramids, 2020, 2040, 2060

Employment increasing from nearly **946,000 jobs in 2020** to nearly **1.5 million jobs in 2060.**

Leading growth sectors include construction, professional, scientific and technical services, and health care and social services,




In Salt Lake County, projected changes result in:

Nearly 484,000 new residents by 2060.

Salt Lake County is projected to remain the largest in the state.
