While growth is projected statewide, expectations vary by county.

Growth of population in Cache County 1940 - 25,797 2020- 133,154 Steady growth of about 20% every 10 years, about 20,000 every decade

2020-2060 Aging pyramid

Employment increasing from nearly 83,000 in 2020 to over 126,000 in 2060. Many different industries will contribute to this growth.

Increase 70% over 40 years for 92,000 people

Low - 187,000 Medium -226,000 High - 263,500

Is it possible to stop Utah's growth?

Utah is growing, how do Utahns feel about it? Survey Envision Utah did last year.

Three main reasons Utahns are concerned about growth:

- Housing = growth puts a pressure on the housing market, driving prices.
- Traffic = growth leads to more traffic to make it longer to get around
- Community & Family

Housing/cost of living is a top priority of Utahns....water is first.

Housing/cost of living has the worst performance at bottom of the list, outdoor recreation is first.
